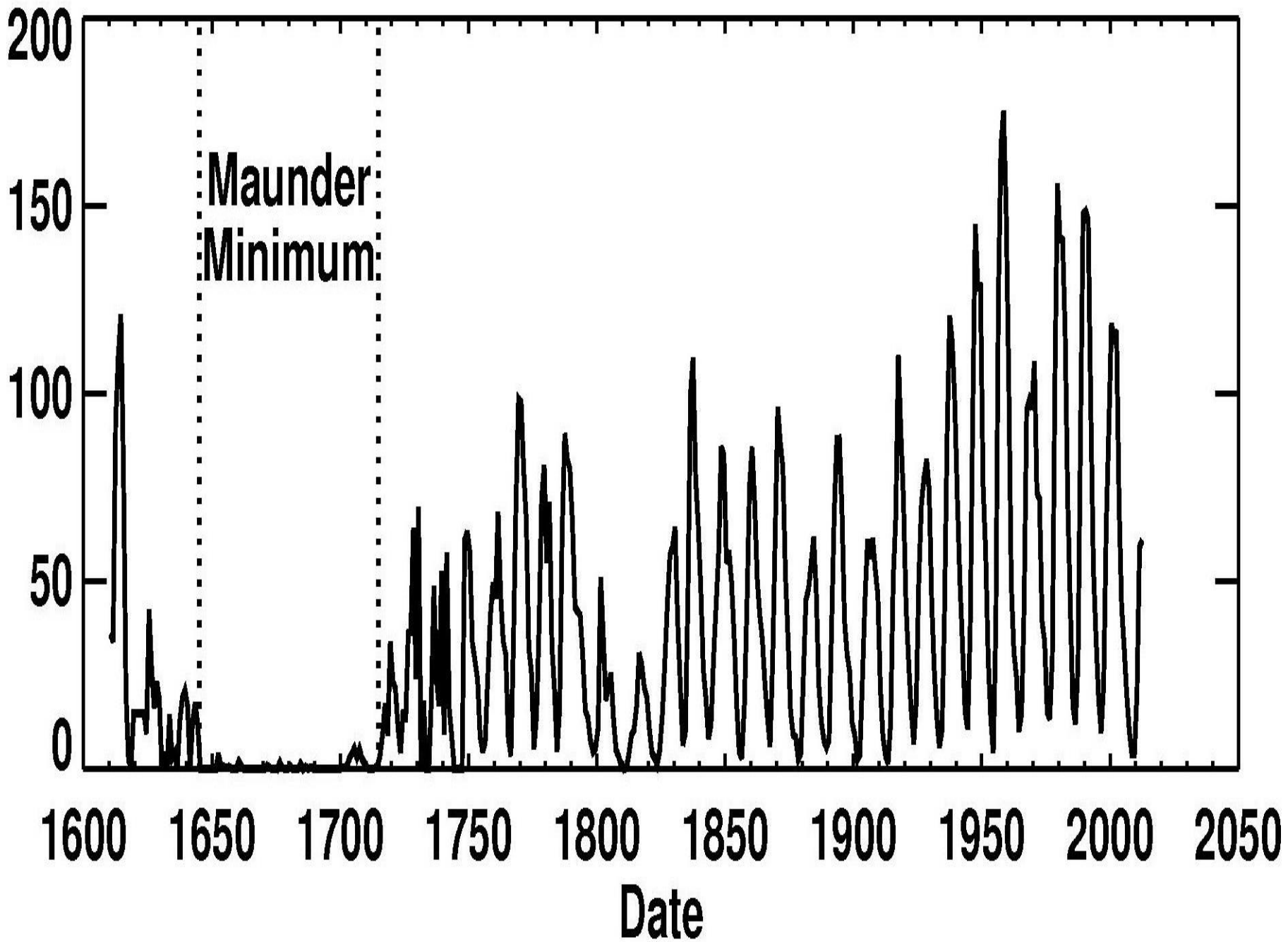




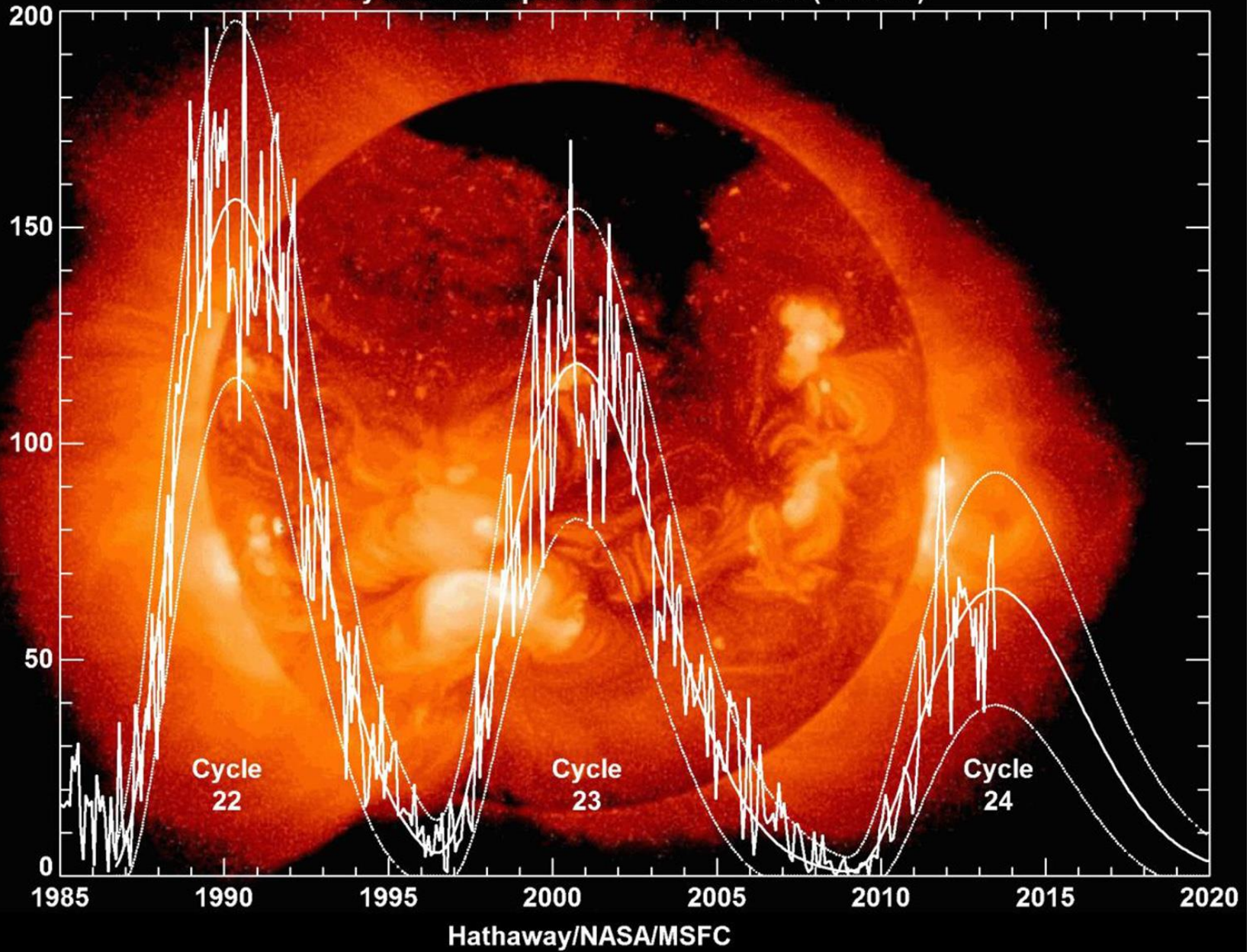




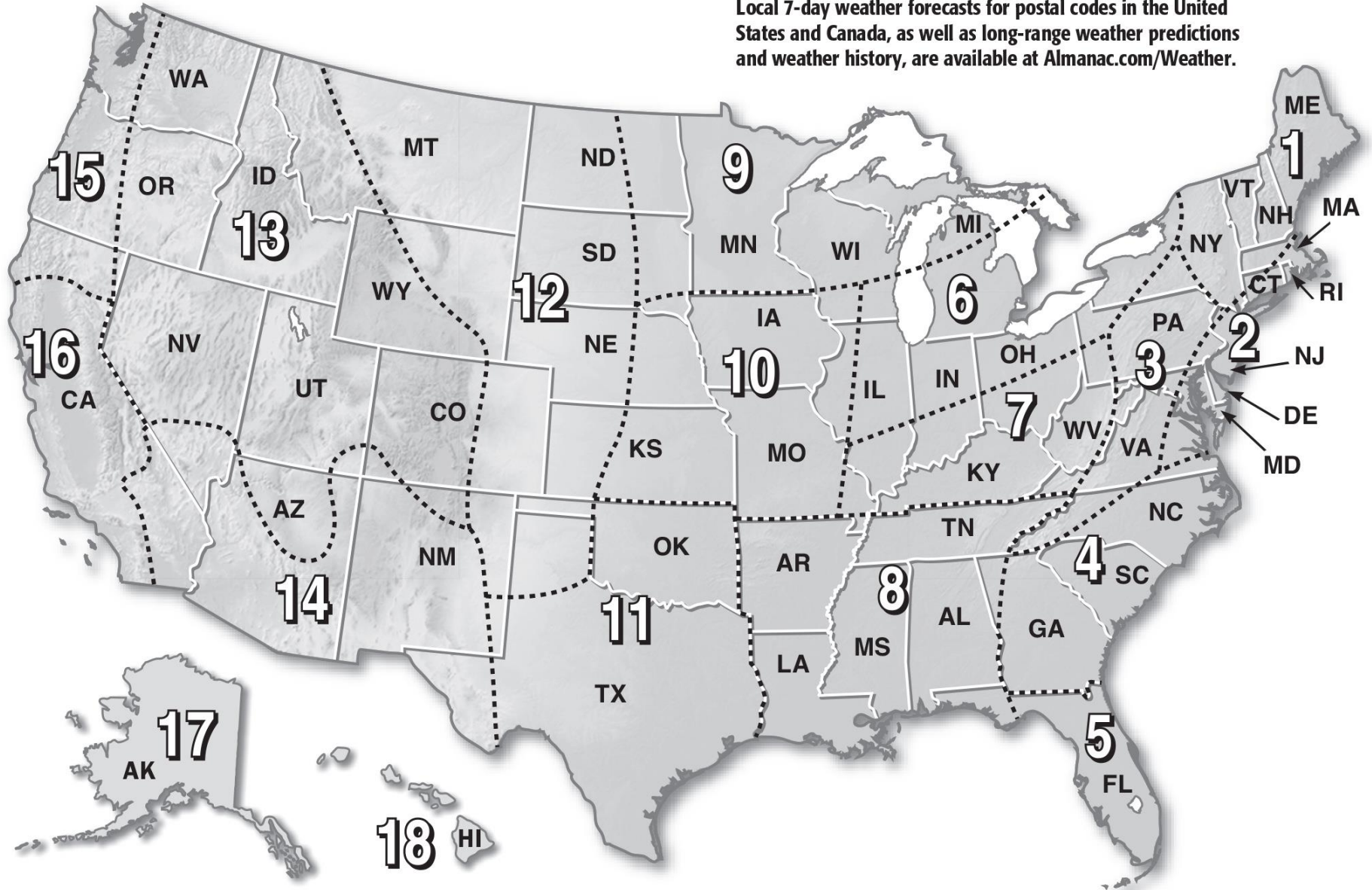




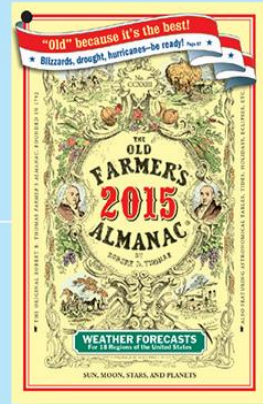
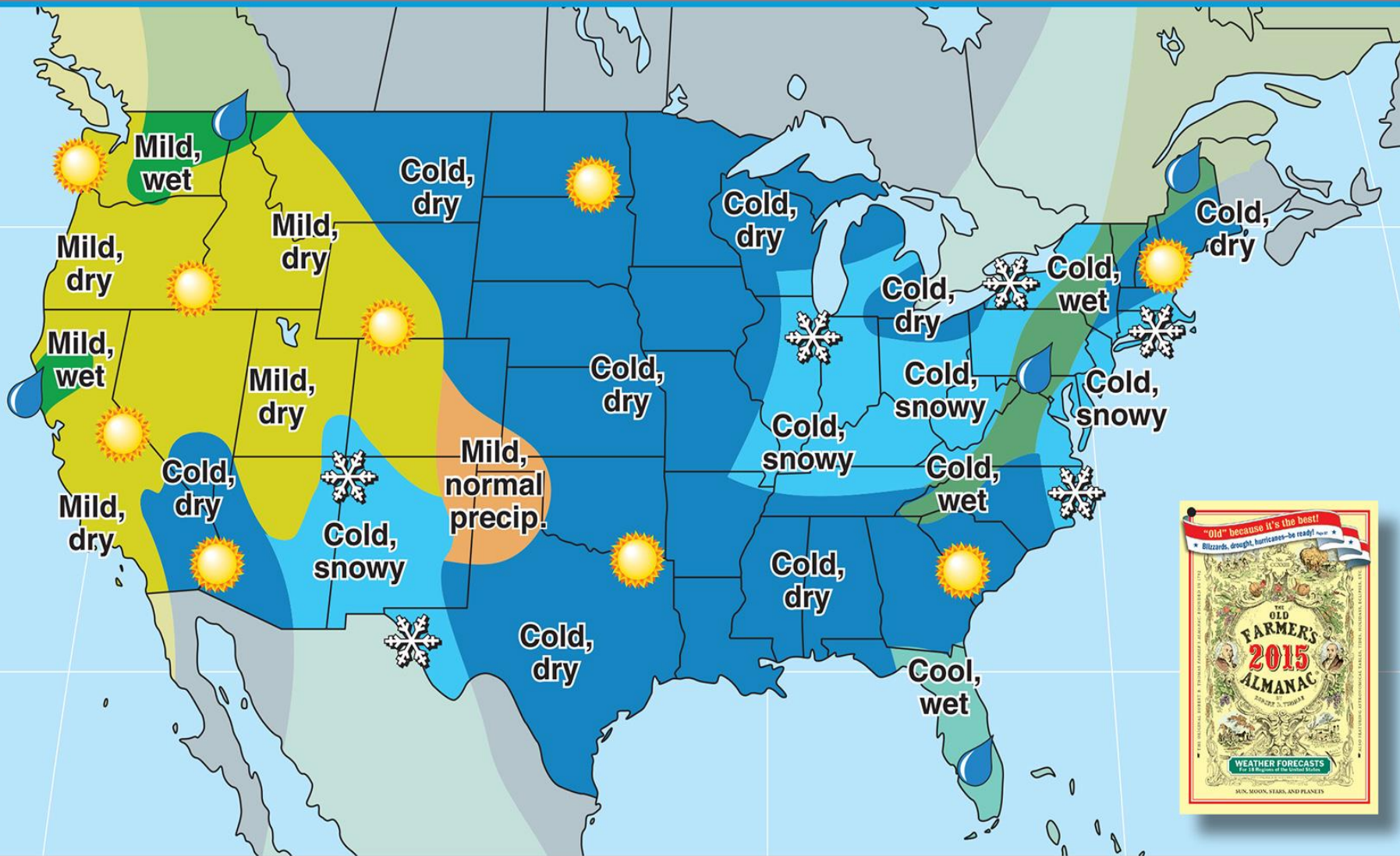
# Cycle 24 Sunspot Number Prediction (2013/07)

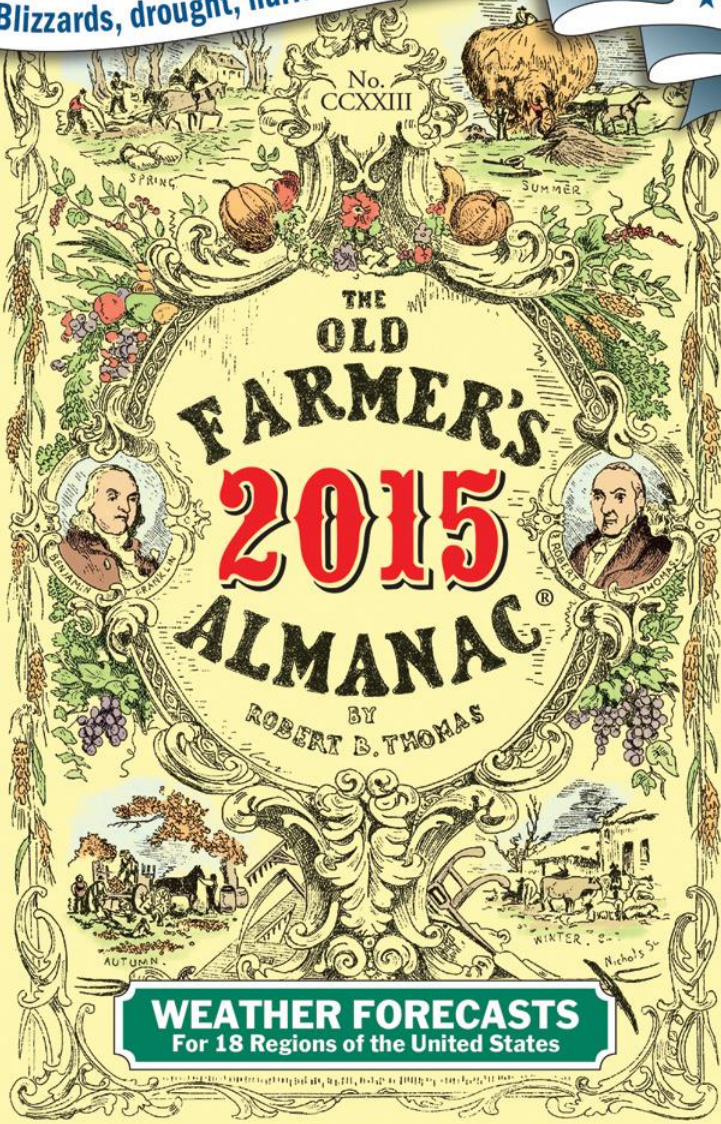
# The Old Farmer's Almanac Weather Map for Winter 2014-15
